Mandela Washington Fellows are accomplished young leaders from every country in Sub-Saharan Africa. A fellowship alumna/us will serve as host and mentor of this unique Virtual Global Internship.

## Description of internship:

With the assistance of UVA student-interns, Vision Care Givers International intends to launch a health awareness campaign promoting personal hygiene and healthy lifestyles using digital tools and infographics across social media. The campaign will involve engagement on five levels: strategic planning, research, fundraising, communications, and social media.

What can an intern expect to learn in this internship?: Student-interns will have the opportunity to practice design thinking and strategic planning in leading health communication activities. Also, as part of our organizational programming, we run a virtual leadership training for young people called 'Vision

Hub' where we train participants in modules that enhance their ability to develop a vision plan, turn plans to actionable steps, learn non-profit leadership, social entrepreneurship, and business management. Within the available time, student-interns may complete some of these modules based on their interests.

## Preferred qualifications:

- Skills in strategic planning, marketing, fundraising, project management, social media, graphic designing and blogging will be relevant.

- Candidates must have the strong motivation to work in diverse teams and across language barriers, if necessary, to facilitate projects in an inclusive and cooperative manner.
- Interns must be highly independent and self-motivated so they can successfully complete projects as assigned and as established by themselves.
- Students must be supremely flexible and willing to contribute to the changing needs of the organization in whatever ways are most useful.
