At present, the organization is initiating projects related to sexual and reproductive health education, civic rights and responsibilities education, and economic empowerment of females with disabilities.

Description of internship:

The intern's work will play an important role in raising the visibility of AIWO-CAN's efforts and enriching its mission.

What can an intern expect to learn in this internship?: Student-interns will have the opportunity to develop skills related to project management, advocacy, and leadership capacity-building.

Preferred qualifications:

UVA requirement: All candidates must be in good academic and disciplinary standing.

- An ideal candidate for this position would have some previous knowledge of or be actively learning about women's issues and development studies.
- Previous experience with fundraising, grant-writing, social media management, communications, and/or project management would be highly appreciated.
- Students should be interested in learning as much as they can about the region- its peoples, its cultures, and its particular conditions.
- Candidates must have the strong motivation to work in diverse teams and across language barriers, if necessary, to facilitate projects in an inclusive and cooperative manner.
- Interns must be highly independent and self-motivated so they can successfully complete projects as assigned and as established by themselves.
- Students must be supremely flexible and willing to contribute to the changing needs of the organization in whatever ways are most useful.

Language requirements:
